International Portfolio Analysis Goals & Background



Goal: Provide a current snapshot of ASD research in the United States, the United Kingdom, and Canada

- Comparison of portfolios across countries
 - Areas of research emphasis
 - Gaps in funding across portfolios

Lead organizations for the project:

- United States: Office of Autism Research Coordination (OARC), National Institutes of Health
- United Kingdom: Autistica
- Canada: Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR)

United States: Interagency Autism Coordinating Committee (IACC)



- Coordinates U.S. government ASD efforts and provides advice on ASD issues
- Includes both government and public members
- Provides a forum for public discussion of ASD issues
- Develops and annually updates a Strategic Plan for ASD
- Develops an annual summary of advances in ASD research
- Monitors government activities related to ASD







United States: Office of Autism Research Coordination (OARC)



- Manage the IACC and ensure that statutory requirements are met
- Facilitate coordination and collaboration among agencies
- Serve as a point of contact for advocacy organizations and members of the public
- Prepare reports on behalf of IACC and HHS
- Conduct government-wide portfolio data collection and analysis







United Kingdom: Autistica



- The UK's leading autism research charity
 - Funds and promotes groundbreaking medical research
 - Improves understanding of autism
 - Advances new therapies and interventions
- Research strategy is driven by the views of the autism community
- Autistica's vision is to give everyone affected by autism the chance of a long, happy, healthy life



Building brighter futures through autism research

Canada: Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR)



- Canada's government funding agency for health research
- Composed of 13 institutes
- CIHR collaborates with partners and researchers to support the discoveries and innovations that improve health and strengthen Canada's health care system



2016-2017 IACC Strategic Plan





- Provides a blueprint to guide autism-related efforts across U.S. government agencies and partner private organizations.
- The IACC SP is organized around 7 research topics:
 - Screening and Diagnosis
 - Underlying Biology
 - Risk Factors
 - Treatments and Interventions
 - Services
 - Lifespan Issues
 - Infrastructure and Surveillance



Data Collection

- U.K.: collected data from a national research database
- U.S. & Canada: collected data via data call to agencies and organizations

Funding Mechanisms

- U.K.: projects are funded in the first year of the project period
- U.S. & Canada: project funding is mixed, some projects receive all funding in first year while other projects receive funding annually





International Portfolio Analysis Comparisons Across Countries




- In 2016, the three portfolios had similar investments in research topic areas
- Top areas of ASD Research across Country Portfolios:
 - Underlying Biology of ASD
 - Treatments and Interventions for ASD symptoms
- Gap Areas across Country Portfolios:
 - Services research
 - Lifespan Issues
- Differences in funding priorities across countries:
 - US and Canada have larger investments in risk factors research than the UK
 - Lifespan research was a greater portion of projects in UK and Canada than the US

- Report will provide a deeper dive into differences in the types of research across countries




