PIHP

- What's so special about PIHP???
 - × Pre-paid Inpatient Health Plan
 - ▼ It covers most health care needs except hospitalization
 and prescription drugs; health care providers, including
 doctors, are part of the network

Snap shot of ACAP

- CMS approved ACAP in January 2009
 - 70+ people are enrolled; funding exists for 108
- Eligibility Criteria:
 - Pennsylvania Resident
 - 21 years of age or older
 - Have an Autism Spectrum Diagnosis
 - Meet Functional Eligibility
 - Meet Level of Care (ICF/ORC or ICF/MR)
 - Meet Financial Eligibility
 - Need no more then 16 hours of awake support per day

- Homemaker/Chore Services
- Most Medical Care needs are covered
- Non-Medical Transportation
- Nursing Facility Services
- Respiratory Services
- Supported Employment
- Supports Coordination
- Targeted Case Management
- Therapies

*Other services may be provided as deemed necessary by the supports team.

Autism Specific Training

SPeCTRUM – **S**upporting **P**erson **C**entered **T**raining, **R**esources, **U**nderstanding, and **M**entorship (9 Modules)

- Autism Spectrum Disorders
- Supporting the Client's Family
- Using Positive Behavior Support
- Recognizing Communication Challenges
- Using Assessments
- Teaching Life Skills
- Health Care for Adults with ASD
- Transition to Work or Higher Education
- Identifying Housing Options

Program Design - Provider

- Managed Care / Capitated model
- Administered by the provider & monitored by the state
- Single provider & Network for a defined geographic area (currently 4 counties)
- Core services provided by ACAP provider
- Network of contracted providers for other services

Program Design - Services

- Team—centric Services
- Supports can be meaningfully coordinated across a single network
- Behavioral and (most) medical services are integrated in a single plan
- Providers of medical services are trained and part of the supports team
- Faster response to changing needs of the participant
- Each participant must have a Behavioral Support Plan

Outcome Measures

- Success is measured against outcomes
 - **▼** Increased hours of employment (paid or volunteer)
 - ▼ Decreased psychiatric hospitalizations and medication
 - Decreased involvement with law enforcement
 - **Improved capacity to perform independently**
 - **▼** Decreased frequency and length of crisis
 - **▼** Decreased family stress

Assessments

- Services are Assessment driven
 - Administered annually:
 - Scales of Independent Behavior Revised
 - Quality of Life Questionnaire
 - Parental Stress Scale
