Legislative Update

- The Autism CARES Act of 2019, which authorizes the IACC, will expire September 30, 2024.
- The House of Representatives and the Senate have each introduced draft reauthorizing legislation (the Autism CARES Act of 2024):
 - House version: <u>H.R. 7213</u> passed the House on September 18, 2024
 - Senate version: <u>S. 4762</u>
- A single version will need to be passed by the House and Senate, then signed by the President in order to become law.





Legislative Update





- If reauthorizing legislation is enacted before expiration of the current legislation:
 - Current IACC member terms will be extended for 180 days to finish reports in progress.
 - A call for nominations of new IACC members will be posted
- In the event of a delay in reauthorization:
 - The work of the IACC <u>will pause</u> until the reauthorization is enacted.
 - If the delay is short, after the reauthorization the current IACC will be extended to finish reports.
 - Funding for many federal autism research, services, and support activities <u>will</u> <u>continue</u>; some may be impacted by a delay in reauthorization.
 - The work of the National Autism Coordinator and the Federal Interagency Workgroup on Autism (FIWA) <u>will continue</u>.
 - Following the enactment of reauthorizing legislation, a call for nominations of new IACC members will be posted.

2024 IACC Strategic Plan Update Timeline



- The previous committee under the Autism CARES Act of 2014 convened a working group and workshops to explore issues related to co-occurring health conditions and began drafting a report that was paused in 2019 after the members' terms expired.
- October 2023: The current IACC voted to focus the 2024 IACC Strategic Plan Update on co-occurring physical and mental health conditions and their impacts on health outcomes, building upon the work of the previous committee and working group.
- January 2024: IACC issued a RFI to collect public feedback on co-occurring conditions.



- August 2024: ONAC completed a draft of this report and sent it to IACC members for review.
- Former members of the IACC Working Group on Improving Health Outcomes were also invited to provide feedback on the draft.
- Early-mid September 2024: ONAC staff incorporated feedback from IACC members and Working Group members into a revised draft. The revised draft was sent to IACC members for further input. The revised draft report is also posted on the IACC website.
- TODAY: IACC members will discuss the draft report and any additional revisions that are needed. IACC members may vote to approve the draft report.



• If the IACC <u>approves</u> the draft report today, ONAC will prepare the final report, with anticipated publication in December 2024.

• If the IACC <u>does not approve</u> the draft report today, ONAC will continue making revisions and finalize the report with IACC members at a later date, which will be determined based on the status of the Autism CARES Act reauthorization.
